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Abstract

This journal aims to investigate the students' improvement on speaking ability through the application of Problem-Based Learning Method. There were 29 students of SMA N.1 Amanuban Selatan as the participants. The researcher used Classroom Action Research as the method and collect the data by using test, in the form of pretest and posttest and observation check-list for the teacher and the students'. The result of the study indicated that Problem-Based Learning Method can improve students' speaking ability. Their improvement covered, the students being active in the process of teaching and learning, pronouncing the words clearly with few errors, being able to construct a simple sentence fluently, accuracy, grammar and also vocabulary reflect the topic, and the students being able to create content of the dialogue which is relevant to the topic.

Foreign language learners see that their native language completely different from English while an opportunity to learn English and practice in their real-life is very limited in time and space. Therefore, they need more practice to speak English.to consider the importance of speaking skill, the students must master not only the theory but also the practice of speaking. The latest curriculum of 2013 recommends the use of scientific approach in its teaching learning process.
