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ABSTRACT

This research is conducted to identify lecturer's strategies in teaching listening. The participant of this study is one lecturer of English department of STKIP SoE who teach listening class. The Qualitative method is apply to collect the data with semi-structured interview as the instrument . The result of this research revealed that from the problems appeared in listening class such as lack of vocabulary, different English background, being unfamiliar with the words, difficult in creating material and students' lack of confidence can be overcome by teaching the students using the brainstorming, giving exercise in listening class, and play the recording for several times as the lecturer's strategies in teaching listening.

INTRODUCTION

Listening is the ability to receive and interpret messages accuretly in the communication process. Listening is not only about hearing something but also to know what people say. According to Hsu, et al. (2013) among these aspects, listening is an important capability of social interactions, and it has been found that people receive new messages more efficiently via listening than reading.

According to Yusnida, et al. (2017) Listening is one of the skills that need to be mastered by university students. The ability to listen and understand a person talking in English to communicate with other people is important. Students who are good at listening will understand more about what the speaker says. It means that listening is like a sequencial process in which after listening to someone then the listeners should respond what the speaker is talking about.

However, there are some difficulties faced by the learners who are learning English especially in listening. The difficulties are lack of vocabulary, different English background, being unfamiliar with the words, difficult in creating material and students' lack of confidence in learning listening. The problems also supported by Hamouda (2013) stated that there are three difficulties in listening class. They are first, pronounciation, second, lack of vocabulary, and the
